The Turabian Manual of Style permits two systems of documentation, the *notes/bibliography style* (used mostly in the humanities and in some social sciences) and the *author/date-reference list style* (used in most social sciences and in the natural and physical sciences). Either style may be used depending on the assignment and the instructor's preferences; but within a specific paper, <u>always follow a single style consistently.</u>

Use the shortened form for the second and subsequent citations of the same work.

Bibliographies and Reference lists should be in alphabetical order by author's last name (or by title if there is no author).
